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Human Services Chamber Welcomes Gina Marsh Back as Executive Director

Former Executive Director returns to lead the Chamber during a pivotal time for Hamilton County's human services sector

The Human Services Chamber of Hamilton County (HSC) has named Gina Marsh as its next Executive Director, marking the return of a familiar leader whose previous tenure helped shape some of the region's most significant human services policy achievements.

"We are delighted to welcome Gina Marsh as the Human Services Chamber's next Executive Director," said HSC Board Chair Dimity Orlet. "Gina is a respected leader, skilled advocate, and trusted partner to the human services community. She understands how public policy affects people's daily lives and has a proven track record of bringing organizations together to create meaningful change. We are thrilled to welcome her back to the Chamber."

Marsh brings more than two decades of experience in public policy, government relations, coalition building, and nonprofit leadership. Most recently, she led Marsh Solutions, LLC, where she helped nonprofit organizations strengthen their advocacy efforts, build effective coalitions, and engage more strategically with local and state government.

This is not Marsh's first chapter with HSC. She previously served as Executive Director from 2016 to 2021, leading the Chamber through a period of significant growth and impact. During that time, she helped secure passage of Cincinnati's landmark 1.5% Human Services Funding Ordinance, expanded eviction prevention efforts throughout Hamilton County, and partnered with community leaders to establish Everybody Rides Metro, a program that has helped thousands of residents access employment, healthcare, and essential services through reduced-cost and free transit passes.

Marsh said returning to HSC feels deeply personal.

"Returning to HSC truly feels like coming home. Leading this organization was the most joyful and impactful experience of my career, and I am honored to have the opportunity to serve our members once again. I have seen firsthand what is possible when nonprofits, government, and community leaders come together around a common purpose. I look forward to helping HSC bring people together, strengthen our partnerships, and advance policies that create meaningful opportunities for every member of our community."

Marsh will begin her role on August 3, 2026.
